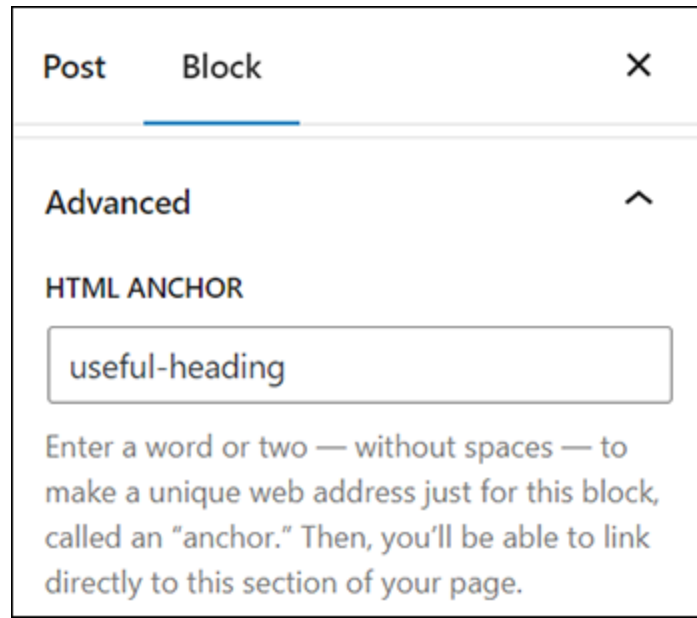

WordPress Block Editor – Block Settings: Advanced

Many types of blocks allow you to use advanced settings and options.

Separate multiple classes with spaces.

Block Settings – Advanced



Note: Block types that support advanced properties must be selected in the content editor area to display the Advanced settings in the Block Settings panel.

View Advanced Settings

To access the Advanced settings for a block that supports advanced properties:

1. Select the block.
2. Select the **Block** settings panel to view the **Advanced** settings option.
3. Enter information into the advanced property fields (see below).

Advanced Properties

You can edit and customize the following settings and options in blocks that support advanced settings:

Title Attribute

The title attribute can be used to add text for a tooltip, an image credit or a description of the image, etc.

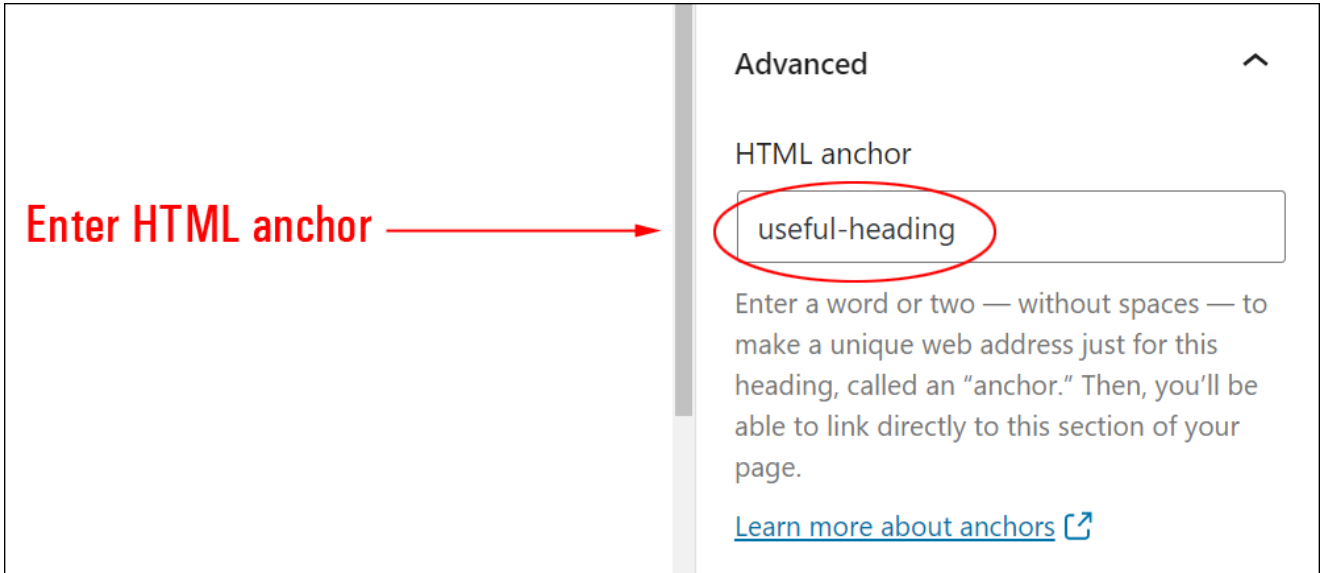

HTML Anchor

This lets you create a unique web address to send users directly to this block using a unique jump link URL.

Using HTML Anchors

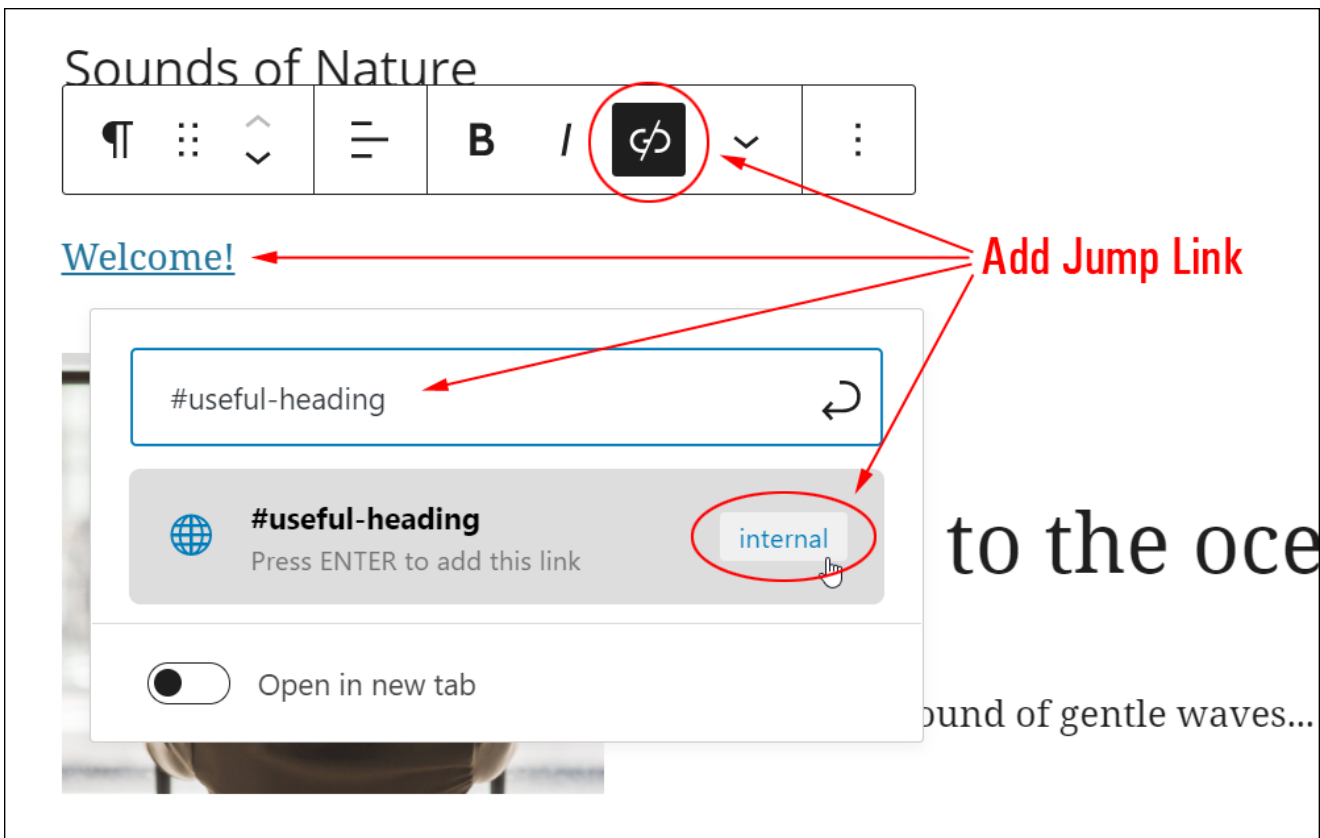
To create a Jump Link, enter a word or two (no spaces allowed, but hyphens, underscores, colons, and periods are ok) into the *HTML anchor* field in the Advanced block settings section to create a unique web address (e.g. *useful-heading*).



Enter your anchor text in the HTML Anchor field.

Next, select the element in your content that you want to add a jump link to and enter your HTML anchor text preceded by a hash symbol (#).

Press Enter to add this link, then save and publish/update your post or page.



Add your Jump Link to your content.

Users can now go directly to the section of your content (i.e. the block) tagged with the HTML anchor by either:

- Clicking on the internal link in the content, or
- Entering the link's unique URL in their web browser (e.g. <https://yourdomain.com/page-slug/#useful-heading>).

Additional CSS Class(es)

This field lets you add multiple CSS classes to your block separated with spaces. This allows you to write custom CSS and style the block as you see fit.

Note: This requires having knowledge of **CSS** (Cascading Style Sheets).
